# THE ROLE OF CONFIDENTIAL RESOURCE PROVIDERS

How they help you navigate your options at BU

#### **OVERVIEW**

Confidential Resource Providers (CRPs) are free resources for any BU community member (student, faculty, or staff).



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### **SUPPORTIVE MEASURES**

CRPs can help you access available school- or work-based supportive measures related to academics, residence life, and employment.

### **RESOLUTION OPTIONS**

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CRPs can help you review available options, including legal resources through enforcement agencies and administrative procedures at BU.

> CRPs can review counseling and medical health services available on campus and through local community-based rape crisis or domestic violence centers.

### **PERSON OF SUPPORT**

CRPs can accompany you to a meeting with the Office of Judicial Affairs or the Equal Opportunity Office as you navigate BU's response to sexual misconduct reports.

#### **CONFIDENTIAL**

CRPs are confidential and are not required to report potential policy violations to a member of the Title IX Team.
