Study Trips

Undergraduate students are also encouraged to take part in our study trips as a fun way to complement classroom learning and to see for themselves the transformations in Central and Eastern Europe. Every semester, an integration trip and one week-long educational trip (which is covered by the cost of tuition) are organised for students to enjoy and gain practical experience on the topics they are learning about. Students visit with local government officials, EU representatives, cultural and social organisations.





Tuition and Fees

The fees cover all instruction (including language courses), one study-trip abroad per semester, as well as access to all CES and university student facilities. The tuition fees do not cover room, board or the costs of additional study trips.

Rooms consist in two and three-person rooms that are furnished. The cost per person is currently 345 zł per month (approximately 100\$ per month), which includes utilities and internet access.

Living in the dorms is convenient and cheap. The dorms are located in the center of the city and are near to CES classes (10-15 minutes walk).

Alternatively students may also rent a private apartment.

The Centre for European Studies has a staff member who is responsible for researching available flats in Krakow. He/she will make appointments with the owners of the flats. He/she will be available throughout the day to visit the flats with the students, and will also help students negotiate the terms of the contract with the owner of the property.
