An outstanding scholar activist, Marlene Gerber Fried is one of few women in the US who have done as extensive organizing, educating and research around Reproductive Health and Justice issues. Dr. Fried is a Professor of Philosophy and Co-Director of the Civil Liberties and Public Policy Program at Hampshire College, receiving her Ph.D. from Brown University. She has edited or co-authored prizewinning books on reproductive health and rights, and was co-author of the 2005 Abortion chapter in *Our Bodies, Ourselves*. For more than a quarter of a century Marlene has drawn thousands of students to the inspiring Hampshire annual conference, "From Abortion Rights to Social Justice: Building the Movement for Reproductive Freedom", a unique weekend immersion in these issues with activists and experts from across the globe.
