Vietnam

Our project goal in Vietnam is to improve primary care by assisting in the development, implementation and evaluation of a national Family Medicine training program. Our collaborative projects aim to develop curriculum, build faculty capacity, and create training sites that will utilize the Family Medicine model as the cornerstone for the delivery of primary health care to the people of Vietnam.

Lao People's Democratic Republic

The Lao People's Democratic Republic has some of the lowest health indicators worldwide. We are collaborating with the University of Health Sciences to train district-based providers as Family Medicine specialists to improve primary health care in disadvantaged rural communities.

Partners in Lesotho

The Collaborative, with its partner the Lesotho-Boston Health Alliance, aims to strengthen management, policy, planning, and clinical capacity in the health sector of Lesotho. We intend to assist the Ministry of Health and Social Welfare in their response to the HIV/AIDS crisis.
