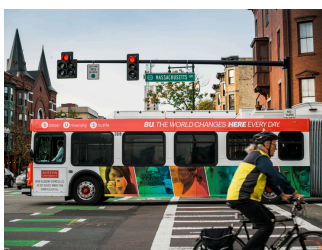

Terrier Terms

Learn more about our acronyms and abbreviations below:

BU Beach: A sloping, grassy plaza on the university grounds, featuring trees, a sculpture & paved pathways.

Comm Ave: Abbreviation for Commonwealth Avenue, a major street in Boston that runs straight through campus.

The Charles: Short for the Charles River, which runs through eastern Massachusetts and alongside our main campus.

Esplanade: This 17-mile stretch of land alongside the Charles River is where you can go to run, bike, stroll, relax, and more, once the weather finally allows.

Beanpot: This annual ice hockey tournament, held the first two weeks of February, pits four Boston-area college hockey teams (BU, BC, Northeastern, & Harvard) against one another for a year's worth of bragging rights. BU holds the record for most wins, with 30.

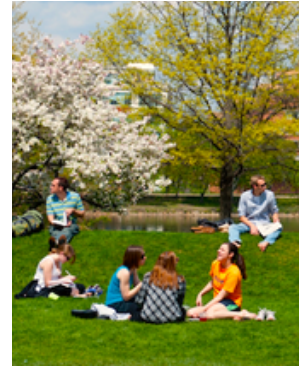
The Castle: This mansion, located on 225 Bay State Road, is home to both the BU Club (dining club for alumni, staff, and faculty) and the newly rehabbed BU Pub (open to all BU community members).

The T: Abbreviation for Greater Boston's subway system (the MBTA) with stops near all three campuses.

MED: Abbreviation for our Medical Campus, located in Boston's historic South End and next-door to Boston Medical Center.

Fenway: Fenway may refer to the historic baseball stadium and home of the Boston Red Sox OR the BU Fenway Campus, which includes residence halls, a dining hall, a theater, and more.

CRC: Abbreviation for the Charles River Campus, the university's main campus, located along the Charles River in Boston's Fenway-Kenmore and Allston neighborhoods.
