Among these are his decision to be baptized despite his Jewish identity and conflicted relations with Catholicism and his stays in mental institutions, including the last twenty-eight years of his life. In this lecture, though, he is considered simply as a talented mystical writer whose mature poems often consist of descriptions of visions.

Naomi Lindstrom teaches at the University of Texas. Her areas of interest include gender, Latin American Jewish Studies, literary translation, sociology of the arts, and the comparative study of Jewish life in the Americas.
