BOSTON UNIVERSITY SCHOOL OF LAW STATEMENT REGARDING PLAGIARISM

All students must sign this statement:

Plagiarism. Plagiarism is the use, without adequate attribution, of theideas, expressions, or work, of another. All written work, whether in preliminary or final form, submitted by a student in the course of law study, in the course of employment, or in the course of other activities, including but not limited to moot court and law journal work, whether or not related to the study or profession of law, is assumed to be the student's own work. Anything copied or paraphrased from another author or source must be appropriately identified, acknowledged, and attributed. The use of the exact language of another without identification as a direct quotation by quotation marks or otherwise is plagiarism even though the source is cited in the student's work. Absent explicit authorization from a student's professor, faculty advisor, or supervising attorney, this provision prohibits the use of content or text generated by technological tools in any written work product submitted by students in the course of law study, in the course of employment, or in the course of other activities enumerated above, without proper attribution. Violation of the rules stated in this paragraph may subject a student to disciplinary action, including suspension or expulsion. Use of the work of another without proper attribution constitutes plagiarism whether or not the writer acts with an intent to mislead or deceive. However, such intent, or the lack of it, may be considered in determining the proper sanction if a violation is established.
