Boston University Scholarships

Name of Scholarship: Boston University African Studies Foreign Language & Area Studies Brief Description: The Foreign Language and Area Studies (FLAS) Fellowships support students who study African language and area studies courses during the academic year or who enroll in intensive language study during the summer.

Brief Description: The fellowship is available to entering or continuing graduate students who are U.S. citizens pursuing master's, doctoral, or professional degrees in any department or school. The recipient of this award will be selected on the basis of having displayed academic proficiency and future promise in a field related to race relations or urban problems.

Name of Scholarship: William V. Shannon

Brief Description: The Fellowship provides a tuition scholarship (up to full, with the possibility of extension) to students from the Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland to pursue graduate study at Boston University in any department or school. The award may also be used to support short-term research visits, events, or special lectures.

Brief Description: For graduate students who focus primarily on international affairs, languages, economics, geography, cartography, physical sciences and engineering. In this program, you will perform meaningful work related to your college major.

Name of Scholarship: Russell E. Train Fellowships

Brief Description: Fellowships to support individuals pursuing a master's or doctoral degree in conservation. Each year, WWF supports committed conservationists from target countries to receive financial support for their studies and field research. Applicants can apply to attend any university around the world and must return to their home countries to work in conservation for at least two years after completing their degree.

Deadline: March 1, 2020

Name of Scholarship: Soros Fellowship for New Americans

Brief Description: Graduate school funding for immigrants and children of immigrants in the United States. Open to graduating seniors, recent alums, and graduate students early in their studies. Apply directly in November.

Name of Scholarship: The Beinecke Scholarship

Brief Description: The Board created an endowment to provide substantial scholarships for the graduate education of young men and women of exceptional promise. Must be a current junior pursuing a bachelor's degree during the academic year of application.

Nomination Deadline: TBA

Eligibility: U.S. citizens and United States nationals from American Samoa and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands.

Name of Scholarship: Charles B. Rangel International Affairs Program

Brief Description: The Rangel Graduate Fellowship is a program that aims to attract and prepare outstanding young people for careers in the Foreign Service of the U.S. Department of State in which they can help formulate, represent and implement U.S. foreign policy. The Rangel Program selects outstanding Rangel Fellows annually in a highly competitive nationwide process and supports them through two years of graduate study, internships, mentoring, and professional development activities.

Name of Scholarship: Intercollegiate Studies Institute

Brief Description: Each year we award up to 15 graduate fellowships to outstanding students pursuing advanced study in the humanities or social sciences. The fellowships range from \$5,000 to \$15,000. The one qualification: the intent to teach at the college level. As Richard M. Weaver observed, "a liberal education specifically prepares for the achievement of freedom."

Name of Scholarship: The James Madison Memorial Fellowship Foundation

Brief Description: The James Madison Memorial Fellowship Foundation offers \$24,000 James Madison Graduate Fellowships to individuals desiring to become outstanding teachers of the American Constitution at the secondary school level. Fellowship applicants compete only against other applicants from the states of their legal residence. As funding permits, the Foundation plans to offer one fellowship per state per year.

Many go on to careers with governments, NGOs, the military, law enforcement, and international organizations like the United Nations and the World Bank.

The fellowship helps finance two-year graduate programs, provides two summer internships, offers mentoring from a Foreign Service Officer, and provides other professional development activities.

Both graduate and postgraduate studies at accredited U.S. institutions are supported.

Name of Scholarship: International Scholarship Programme

Brief Description: The Aga Khan Foundation provides a limited number of scholarships each year for postgraduate studies to outstanding students from select developing countries who have no other means of financing their studies, in order to develop effective scholars and leaders and to prepare them for employment, primarily within the AKDN. Scholarships are awarded on a 50% grant: 50% loan basis through a competitive application process once a year in June or July.

Deadline: March 31, but check website for country specific deadlines that may be earlier.

Eligibility: Nationals of the following countries: Bangladesh, India, Pakistan, Afghanistan, Tajikistan, Kyrgyzstan, Syria, Egypt, Kenya, Tanzania, Uganda, Madagascar and Mozambique. In France, Portugal, UK, USA and Canada, applications are accepted from those who are originally from one of the above developing countries, are interested in development-related studies and who have no other means of financing their education.

Brief Description: Supports study abroad programs in all regions/countries except Western Europe, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand. Focused on geographical areas, languages, and fields of study deemed critical to U.S. national security. Open to graduate students. December deadline. Requires university endorsement.

Name of Scholarship: DAAD Grants for Study and Research in Germany

Brief Description: An agreement between the DAAD (Deutscher Akademischer Austauschdienst, or German Academic Exchange Service) and Boston University provides BU graduating seniors and graduate students the opportunity to apply for study or research scholarships in Germany during the next academic year.

Deadline: October 18

Eligibility: U.S. or Canadian citizens, or permanent residents. Foreign nations may be eligible to apply

Name of Scholarship: Ford Foundation Predoctoral Fellowship

Brief Description: PhD or ScD studies in the US, for students engaged with underrepresented communities committed to a teaching and research career at the college or university level. For seniors, graduate students, and recent alumni. January deadline.

Eligibility: U.S. citizens, U.S. nationals, and U.S. permanent residents (holders of a Permanent Resident Card), as well as individuals granted deferred action status under the Deferred Action for Childhood

Arrivals Program.
