## **Certificate Requirments**

- Successfully complete at least 16 credits of coursework through classes primarily focused on Latin America/the Muslim World with a minimum grade of B (Latin American Studies) or B- (Muslim Studies)
- Include classes from at least two departments or schools
- Complete a piece of research such as an M.A./M.F.A. thesis, doctoral dissertation, or two substantial research papers in graduate-level seminars
- Demonstrate a high level of competence in a regional language (Latin American Studies)/reading knowledge of language relevant to the course of study (Muslim Studies).
