Fellowships & Scholarships

The Office of Fellowships & Scholarships provides guidance to interested students across a variety of external and BU-specific fellowships. BU has been a top producer of Fulbright awardees for the past two years.

UROP

UROP connects BU students with funded, faculty-mentored research projects. The program allows research in any academic area for all full-time undergraduate students. On average, more than 600 students are funded annually.

Undergraduate Advising

Undergraduate Affairs supports the schools and colleges in advisor onboarding and professional development and in sharing best practices for advising. Assistant Directors of First-Year Success provide additional guidance to first-year students.

Center for Teaching & Learning

The CTL partners with faculty, staff, and students to cultivate teaching that is inclusive, centered on student learning, and guided by research. The CTL also offers individualized consultations, workshops, and seminars.



Distinctive Features of the Hub




Promotes cross-disciplinary and interdisciplinary thinking
