Dear Boston University Undergraduate Students,

As you may be aware, last year, over 3,300 of our graduate students formed a labor union – the Boston University Graduate Workers Union (“BUGWU”). The union includes all graduate student workers who are performing research or teaching work for the University.

BUGWU has recently voted to authorize a strike by the graduate workers in the union. They have notified the University that the strike may begin on Monday, March 25. We do not yet know if the strike will occur, or which graduate student workers may strike if it does occur.

If the union does go on strike, although we may need to make adjustments to teaching staff and courses, we expect – *and will do everything we can* – to ensure your education proceeds smoothly. It is up to your teaching assistant or teaching fellow whether they personally want to join a strike. Please know that your education is the centerpiece of what we do at Boston University, and there are robust plans in place to ensure that your courses continue uninterrupted during the period of the strike.

We also want you to know that we seek to arrive at an agreement with our graduate workers and hope we can do so soon. The students in BUGWU are also our students, and we care deeply about their success and working life at Boston University and seek to create conditions that will support their progress. We have made significant offers that we hope will lead to resolution, including improved stipend and hourly payments, a dental insurance option, and increased subsidies for public transportation.
