COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Accounting PhD Seminars (Need 5 courses)

- AC 901 Introduction to Accounting Research Prof. Ana Albuquerque
- AC 909 Contemporary Accounting Topics Lead by Prof. Peter Wysocki (other faculty also teach this course)
- AC 918 Financial Accounting Research Prof. Eddie Riedl
- AC 919 Managerial and Cost Accounting Prof. Michael Smith

Students also take a 5th PhD seminar at HBS/MIT/BC or do a direct study with a faculty in their area of interest. Examples are: PhD Tax Seminar at MIT (MIT 15.539).

In addition, past students have taken classes in Econ department (EC507, 508, 509, EC705, EC707), Math department (MA684, 685), School of Public Health (SPH BS821, BS849), Computer Science (CS111, CS542, CS591), Sargent (SAR RS870), QST SI915, HBS (HBS 4809), MIT (MIT14.387), Harvard Kennedy School (ECON2114, ECON2115), Harvard (ECON2140, S071) amongst others.

Minor (Need 5 courses)

We require students take at least one Micro class, and one Corporate Finance PhD seminar at Boston College or HBS.

Micro classes most students take: *EC501* (too easy) or *EC701* (too hard), *QST IS912*, *EC515* (Marshall Van Alstyne), *EC732*.

Corporate Finance (theory and empirical) classes most students take: Empirical Corporate Finance at BC, HBS *Econ 2725*, *QST MF895*.

In addition, students take the following courses:

- DS 906 Philosophy of Science Fall of first year
- Intensive Teaching Seminar (summer, August after second year)
