MPH Practicum PH976 (240 hours; 0 units)

Integrated Learning Experience PH845 (0 units)

Completed in final semester

- Students will integrate and apply knowledge and skills obtained throughout the degree program through the development of a community grant proposal.
- Students are strongly advised to take at *minimum* the assessment course and the intervention/implementation course before embarking on the ILE.
- Students must be enrolled in, or have completed, the Practicum to be eligible for the ILE.
- The Registrar will enroll a student in PH845 after their graduation application is reviewed.
- One ILE is required per student.
