- In a **one-page, typed, double-spaced statement**, please describe your interest in each scholarship for which you are applying and what qualifies you to be considered for it. Please include a brief assessment (one paragraph within the one page) of your personal financial need. You may apply for as many of these scholarships as you want, but a **different** statement must be submitted for each scholarship. All application material is considered confidential and will be reviewed only by the School's Financial Aid Office and the Award Selection Committee. Kindly note that students who have already received SSW scholarship funds that total full tuition will not be considered for additional scholarship funds.
